AANR Elections Coming in May

Next month, AANR is holding its bi-annual election for President, Vice President, Secretary-Treasurer, and all 14 members of the Board of Trustees. All AANR members are encouraged to vote!



The election will be held May 1 to June 20, and members can vote one of three ways: online, by paper ballot, or by phone.

AANR will be using a firm called Vote-Now to provide election services. Vote-Now will be contacting all members by email to remind them about the election, so please don't discard this email when you receive it early in May. It is NOT spam!

Online voting is secure and easy, so don't be afraid to use it. If you want to vote online, we MUST have your email address, and each AANR member needs their own email address. Couples at the same mailing address typically use the same (one) email address, but you need to separate each person into different emails to vote this way. Call 1-800-TRY-NUDE to register the second email address so the system can accept the second person's ballot.

Government Affairs

One of the primary reasons to belong to AANR (besides having fun) is to support our work that protects our right to be nude through legislation and the courts. and, where possible, to expand social nude recreation opportunities. Here is a summary of recent activity:

In **Colorado**, HB 18-1143 is a repeal of many of the nudity laws in the state which local courts have ruled unconstitutional. For example, a state court in Ft. Collins ruled that women have the same rights to top freedom as men. We are quietly supporting this because we don't want to stir up any opposition. Odds of passage are good.

In Oregon, the legislature has banned alcohol use on the nude beach at **Sauvie Island, near Portland**. Law enforcement wanted this, and it passed the legislature by a large majority.

In California, the state's **Sex Offender Registry** is being reorganized into tiers, with the worst offenders (child molestation, etc.) grouped together and others ranked by the seriousness of the felony. Those ticketed for simple nudity do not need to register in most cases, but we are watching to see how these regulations are re-written.

At **Bates Beach, Santa Barbara County, California**, the local police chief has retired. He agreed not to ticket for nudity there if there were no complaints. We plan to meet the new chief in coming weeks.

In Hawaii, SB 691 proposes to **ban public nudity** in the state, period. It has not yet been scheduled for a hearing and our team sees almost no chance for approval.

Hawaii's HB 2134 is a **revenge porn** bill supported by the women's caucus that is on the verge of passage. The language was tightened so that nudists who share photos are not covered.

We are looking into hosting a **Government Affairs** workshop at the AANR-West convention, so our members can gain a better understanding of what we do to promote or oppose various bills at the federal, state, and local levels.

Welcome our Newest Club: Swim Free Hawaii

On April 1, we welcomed **the Swim Free Hawaii club** to the Western Region. It is a boat charter, based at Honokōhau, Kalaoa, on the western Kona Coast of the "Big Island" of Hawaii.

Captain Chuck Haupert has been conducting fishing charters for 30 years. He and his partner, Nova Neri, established Swim Free Hawaii last year to offer visitors and locals the opportunity to enjoy their charters in a clothing-optional environment.

A Southern California native, Haupert discovered nude recreation in San Diego in the 1970s during the heyday of Black's Beach. Haupert moved in 1978 to the Big Island, and decided to open a fishing charter business. A few years ago, he decided he was getting too old to "wrestle large and angry fish," and he decided to open his boat to those who just want to snorkel, whale watch, or just hang out on the boat at sunset.

Nude recreation throughout Hawaii tends to consist mostly of hard-to-reach beaches. Haupert figured there would be a market for a clothing-optional charter, and business has grown mostly by word of mouth. He says he can take up to six guests per cruise. For parties of less than six, he'll fill the boat with partial groups who, as fellow nudists, inevitably get along.

AANR Booth Attracts the Curious at the Cal Parks & Rec Expo

AANR-West staffed a booth March 14-15 at a trade show sponsored by the California Department of Parks and Recreation. This is the largest regional park and recreation expo show in the nation with about 20,000 park employees attending the 4-day event at the Long Beach Convention Center.
