AANR-WEST SUPPORTS TOP FREEDOM RALLY IN DENVER

AANR-West exhibited at the annual “Denver Go Topless Day” held at Skyline Park in downtown Denver Colorado. The event happens every year on the Sunday closest to Women’s Equality Day (Aug 26), which was the day after the event.

AANR-West VP Cyndi Faber, Board members Jeff Tendick and Ernie Wiese, as well as new AANR President Kathy Watzel and her husband Bob occupied one of only seven booths available to display and promote AANR and AANR Western Region.

The booth was set up with 3 backdrops, literature and club information along with freebies such as pens, note pads, lip balm, emery boards, “Nudist and I Vote” buttons, temporary tattoos and AANR bumper stickers. One attendee was very proud of his bike helmet and immediately placed the round sticker along with many others on his “personal billboard helmet”.

The AANR West Beach balls were blown up and distributed for playful activities in the open grassy area of the park. Additionally, t-shirts and cool-neck sport towels were offered as bonus incentives for attendees to **join AANR on the spot**. A laptop (with internet access) displayed the *AANR.COM* website. We had five people join during our time there! We also offered club brochures and Mountain Air Ranch, the nearest club, offered free day passes.

At one of the other booths we saw body painters busily decorating people’s bodies with messages.

At 3:00 pm, several hundred top free women and men paraded down Denver’s central mall and rallied at the capitol building with speeches and placards (see photo below). We saw several bystanders spontaneously joined in.

The organizers said they had an easier time this year, since the state supreme court had recently ruling that women could be top free anywhere an man could be top free. With greater acceptance, we were told there was less far fewer gawkers and paparazzi than in previous years.

A Denver Parks and Recreation ranger patrolling on bicycle told us there were no arrests made or citations issued.

Will we do it again next year? Absolutely!



Convention News



AANR CONVENTION BRINGS TOGETHER CLUB LEADERS FROM ACROSS N. AMERICA

Immediately following the AANR-West convention, the AANR International convention rolled into town at De Anza Springs. Delegates and others from around North America came together to discuss AANR policy and direction, witness the installation of the new officers and several new trustees, take care of ceremonial activities, and participate in informational workshops.

As AANR-West Regional President I attended the AANR convention at De Anza. Aside from the ceremonial changing of the guard, very little business of substance was decided during our six days of meetings and workshops, although there was progress made on several fronts. There was an emotional tribute to AANR Trustee and longtime head of the current Finance Committee Bob Campbell who passed away in April in a car accident.

Kathy Watzel of Colorado's Mountain Air Ranch was sworn in as president but made few immediate changes in policy or committee chairs from the previous administration.

Erich Schuttauf, the interim Executive Director, was asked to stay on while the Trustees begin the search for his successor. The Exec Dir supervises the day to day operations of the staff at the main office in Kissimmee, Florida. AANR's member software is about 30 years old and in desperate need of replacement. Everyone agrees but what the new database program will be remains undecided as the committee assigned to review different client management packages has not yet completed its task. So, no recommendation could be voted on. They expect that decision in the next few months with as much as a year more for full implementation. The cost is expected to be in the \$100k range.

Part of the new system will be the ability to automatically renew one's membership without filling out a form and sending in a check each year and allowing club members to renew online (currently they must renew at their clubs.)

One highlight of each convention is the Annual Report from the seven AANR Regional Presidents, who meet separately and recommend to the Trustees changes they

feel are important. This year, the recommendations included requiring all clubs to conduct background checks on all their members and guests (not all do it) and for AANR to do the same for all who sign up on their website at the main office. This topic was last debated in 2005. The Presidents also asked for some guidance how to enforce the AANR non-discrimination policy, as some clubs still bar singles, children, same sex couples, tattoos, body jewelry, etc. The Trustees took the recommendations under advisement.

AANR loves to give out awards! About a dozen awards were announced, including one to Mountain Air Ranch in Colorado for the highest membership gain during 2017. Southern California Naturist Association won for Best Newsletter (small club size) and Best Web Site (done by a non-professional).

The AANR convention in 2019 will be held at Sun Meadows Resort in Idaho, August 7-10. The 2020 convention was awarded to Star Ranch near San Antonio, Texas.

GLEN EDEN CLUB “100% BACK” AFTER FOREST FIRE

The Glen Eden Sun Club in Corona CA is back to normal operations two weeks after a devastating forest fire burned right up to the back of its Sky View homes area.

Cheryl Leutbacher, the club’s marketing manager, reports some 20 residents and staff stayed behind during the 5-day evacuation to water down homes and other buildings as the flames approached. Tanker aircraft dropped orange Foscheck retardant while water-dropping helicopters dropped their loads for several days to protect the park. After the danger passed, she said, these volunteers cleaned up much of the ash from roads, patios and roofs so the place was livable once the evacuation order was lifted.

A “Thank You” lunch celebration was held for all the residents on August 25. A slide show at Piper Hall showed how closed the park had come to disaster and how the local firefighters saved the day. Many residents shared stories of staying at nearby hotels while waiting to learn the fate of the park.

Leutbacher wants to thank the nudist community who followed frequent reports from the park on Facebook and Twitter and gave GE their thoughts and prayers during the ordeal. “We are back in business 100%,” she said. “come on back and enjoy the park!”

The games began with the ODR Team bringing the cup back to the stage in a proud procession to the tune of Queens "We Are the Champions"! Some of the games, such as the Water Cup Relay, Hula Hoop Pass, and Noodle Race, were old favorites. Another popular event at the pool is the Water Bottle Dive, where teams had to retrieve plastic bottles full of water from the bottom of the pool in one breath. We brought back two favorite games from last year, the Pool Noodle Javelin Toss, and the Inner Tube Pool Relay. Before we moved down to the bowl for the popular Water Balloon Toss, and the only individual game, the Frisbee Toss, we stopped at the volleyball court for a few rounds of a demonstration sport, Water Balloon Volleyball. The last event was the traditional Pudding Toss where many kids of all ages let out their frustrations on each other with a choice of chocolate or vanilla in a friendly exchange of gooey delight.

At the awards ceremony Rolf presented individual medals and the team trophy. The first place Individual Winner was Trace Register of Olive Dell with 19 points. Second Place went to Brian M. of SCNA, and third place was awarded to David Bruce of the NitOC club. Brian and David had tied for second place with 15 points each but Brian edged out David in a tie-breaking shoot-out with beach balls tossed through the javelin targets in the pool. The Winners Club Trophy went to Olive Dell Ranch.

Each club had their own scorekeeper to double check each other. Olive Dell Ranch scored 153 points, NitOC

scored 141 points, and SCNA scored 132 points; it was that close! SCNA had a much better showing this year and we thank and congratulate those who played the games. With one or two more participants we might take the trophy back next year!

Brian, who is also a relatively new SCNA member had this to say about the Games:

"This was my first Nude Summer Games and I had a blast! It was very well run with lots of very friendly people. The facilities were clean and well kept. The crowd was inclusive of all age groups and abilities. The games were just challenging enough so that you had fun trying, but silly enough that if you were not athletically gifted you still contributed and had a laugh.

As a new member I was not sure what to expect, was this going to be a cut throat afternoon with people being excluded and others going home upset, or a fun afternoon in the sun? I was very pleased to find that everyone was included who wanted to play, and good sportsmanship was the culture of the day.

The team competitions were thankfully organized so that you were placed with members of other clubs and you had a stress-free way to meet new people and experience the best that all of the clubs had to offer."

After the awards ceremony, Bobby Kilborn served up a delicious dinner of BBQ-style pork strips, corn on the cob, roasted red potatoes, salad, dinner roll, and a homemade strawberry-filled cupcake.
